They were just awarded a contract in Morrill and wanted to "piggy back" with Unity which could save us money. Pike will be doing Burnham and would offer a discount as well. Mike wanted to know why we are going back to the Town and asking for more money instead of handling it all at the original Town meeting. He is very concerned that taxes are going to keep creeping up. The school budget is going up and up, the county budget is going up so with this additional borrowing more money for the town roads, the municipal budget will go up. This all translates to higher taxes. He said that we need to shop around and put it out to bid so that the town can get the best deal. It was stated that the Town needs to be run like a business and work on behalf of the townspeople and their best interest.
