1. Call to Order / Welcome / Introductions.

2. Open Public Comments / Questions / Feedback – none

An announcement was made about the upcoming 14th Annual Maine Downtown Conference on May 2nd in Waterville. Committee members were encouraged to attend.

Christian Carlson made a presentation on a project he is hoping to implement in Unity.

- The project utilizes Aquaponics for raising fish and vegetables.
- Green on top with plants and below is where the fish grow. They support each other.
- Reduced water requirements.
- Waldo County has a lot of growth in AG startups.
- \$6.90/lbs. 620 lbs. is breakeven.
- Yarmouth is the only competition and they market Portland area.
- Time Line Unity College is non-profit this project needs to be profitable.
- A long road ahead. Would like to start as soon as possible. \$15k could be the initial startup costs at barebones no employees. Each \$8K 4 x120 rows.
