Norreen: In 2012 the total TIF distribution was \$43K, divided 3 ways.

\$10K to truck fund,\$ 4400 to fire dept.

in 2013 only the truck fund and fire dept. parts were distributed.

Noreen and the selectmen are now In the process of working with the assessor and correcting for Family Dollar inclusion in TIF district, and checking for consistency in what values (real, business assets) were included.

Clem: some restaurant businesses for example seem to be struggling.

Unity needs places for people to stay. Could we incentivize a motel? The committee had a long discussion on the need for a motel. Step one: determine the demand for it. What are the other next steps?
