Chris spoke with Christian who is discouraged about his aquaponics business idea.

Christian needs a business plan. We could refer him to various agencies, such as SCORE or the Small Business Development Center for small business development and funding for assistance with his business plan. Then he could come back to the committee with a plan and a specific request for assistance.

Jean: Marijuana growers and caregivers are now in town. It's agricultural and local small scale business and brings in a lot of tax revenue. Noreen: got old town reports and a summary of Quality Main Street Study Report from 1996. Need copies of the full study report.

5. Discussion about Penny's suggestion to hold input meeting of businesses.

It was decided that one meeting would be better than three separate meetings. That approach would allow connections to be made between businesses. Some businesses—such as an agricultural business that makes and sells product falls into all three categories. With a one-meeting approach such a business will not need to decide which meeting to attend. The agreed goal was to plan a meeting for July. Planning for the meeting includes, develop an agenda and format, assembling the invitation list and deciding how to get the word out.

Jean: business pages at <u>unityme.org</u> need to be reviewed. Farms need to be added as businesses.

Discussion on need for overnight accommodation in Unity.

Find out who considered building one a few years ago and why they decided not to. Establish demand. The Business Input meeting could be one way to assess demand.
